



Plenary Session I: Advances in Understanding Liability

August 6, 2018 8:45 AM – 10:00 AM Marriott Ballroom

Big Data is changing liability insurance markets in a big way. What happens when traditional understandings of underwriting, pricing, and claims resolutions may no longer apply? Professors Alexander and Swedloff will discuss how big data is affecting the law of insurance and Professor Schwarz will talk about data and the economics gaps we still need to fill in.



Professor Charlotte Alexander

Professor Charlotte Alexander is an associate professor of legal studies in the Department of Risk Management and Insurance at the J. Mack Robinson College of Business, with secondary appointments at the College of Law and the Institute for Insight, the business school's data analytics center. She also directs GSU's Legal Analytics Lab, which brings together data science and law faculty to take on legal problems and questions using the tools of data analytics.

Alexander's scholarship focuses on the employment relationship as a source of legal and economic risk for workers and employers, and the ways in which each party responds to workplace problems. She employs a variety of methodologies, including doctrinal and empirical analysis and text mining and machine learning techniques, to investigate workplace disputes and their resolution, with a particular focus on employment litigation trends.

She is presently the Principal Investigator on a project funded by the U.S. Department of Labor that uses text mining and machine learning to analyze judges' decisions in cases where a worker's status as an employee or independent contractor is in dispute, and to predict outcomes. She is also working with interdisciplinary teams of faculty and students on a variety of other legal analytics projects, including one that uses natural language processing techniques to examine private arbitration outcomes in disputes between investors and broker-dealers and between broker-dealers and their employers, and another that uses the same tools to build a predictive model to forecast the outcomes of civil lawsuits in employment-related matters.

Professor Alexander earned her B.A. from Columbia and her J.D. from Harvard Law School.



Professor Daniel Schwarcz

Professor Daniel Schwarcz is an award-winning teacher and scholar. His research focuses on a broad range of issues in insurance law and regulation, spanning systemic risk, regulatory federalism, consumer protection, employer-sponsored health insurance, and insurance coverage litigation. In 2017, the American Law Institute awarded Schwarcz its highly selective Young Scholars Medal, which recognizes the scholarship of one or two outstanding early-career law professors whose work has the potential to influence improvements in the law. He has also been awarded the Liberty Mutual Prize, which is given annually for the most outstanding article on property and casualty insurance law.

Schwarcz's scholarship has been published in a wide range of leading law reviews and journals, such as the *University of Chicago Law Review, Virginia Law Review*, and *the Journal of Empirical Legal Studies*. He is also a co-author of the leading insurance law casebook in the country, *Insurance Law and Regulation* (6th edition), which has been used as the principal text in courses on insurance law in more than 100 American law schools. Media outlets such as the *New York Times, Wall Street Journal*, and National Public Radio have covered Schwarcz's scholarship. He regularly testifies to U.S. Congressional committees on insurance matters, and he has served as an expert witness in a wide range of insurance disputes. From 2007 to 2014, he served as a consumer representative at the National Association of Insurance Commissioners.

At the University of Minnesota, Schwarcz teaches courses on contract law, insurance law, the regulation of financial institutions, commercial law, health care regulation and finance, and judicial opinion writing. He has twice received teaching awards at the Law School, in 2008 and 2012.



Schwarcz earned his A.B., magna cum laude, from Amherst College and his J.D., magna cum laude, from Harvard Law School. While in law school, he was an articles editor for the *Harvard Law Review* and a John M. Olin Fellow in Law and Economics. After law school, he clerked for Judge Sandra Lynch of the United States Court of Appeals for the First Circuit and practiced at the law firm Ropes & Gray, where he worked mainly on insurance law matters. He subsequently spent two years as a Climenko Fellow and Lecturer on Law at Harvard Law School.



Professor Rick Swedloff

Professor Rick Swedloff writes in the areas of insurance law, regulation, and access to the liability system. In recent years, he has written a series of articles on the role of insurance as a regulator of the practice of law at large law firms and the risks that emerge when insurers use big data.

Professor Swedloff teaches courses on civil procedure, remedies, and law and economics.

Prior to joining the Rutgers faculty, Professor Swedloff practiced as a litigation associate with Dechert LLP in Philadelphia, where he specialized in complex commercial, tort, and insurance cases. Before entering private practice, he served as a clerk for Judge Walter K. Stapleton of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit and Judge Roderick R. McKelvie of the U.S. District Court for the District of Delaware. Professor Swedloff earned his B.A. from Haverford College and his J.D. from the University of Pennsylvania.

Prior to joining Sandbox, Lyndsey was a Senior Policy Advisor in the Obama Administration and worked at both the Department of Defense and Department of Homeland Security. Lyndsey started her career at Google, where she worked on the New Business Development team, primarily developing the company's strategy in sub-Saharan Africa.

Lyndsey holds a B.S. and M.S. in Earth Systems from Stanford University.

She holds a Ph.D. in Engineering Sciences from Dartmouth College, has published eleven scholarly journal articles related to her Ph.D. and postdoctoral research on the upper atmosphere, and is an inventor on three patent applications. She has extensive experience translating customer needs into technical solutions; Dr. Cousins and her team have built modeling frameworks for weather and non-weather risk assessments, with current commercial applications proving decision support for a wide range of insurance clients and for the United States intelligence community.

For nearly 20 years, Bill Pardue has been active in acquiring and building data analytics and visualization technologies to serve the Insurance sector and also the U.S. Intelligence and Security Communities. Bill organized Weather Analytics LLC in 2012 to deliver decision-support solutions drawing from the world's largest and most granular collection of web-enabled atmospheric, soil and topographical information.

A Harvard Law graduate, Bill began his legal career as an insurance defense attorney. He later served as President & CEO at online information provider LexisNexis in the United States and Europe and as Chief Global Product Officer. In 1999, Bill founded the Insurance practice and Risk Solutions groups at LexisNexis, which now operates in 175 countries.

Bill left LexisNexis to join Gartner Inc. as President of Gartner Intelligence, the global IT research firm, and later founded Qbase LLC, a data management and analytics company with operations in the U.S. and the Middle East. Bill's M&A work has included acquiring software and information businesses from Nokia and from *The Financial Times*. Bill co-founded the strategic advisory and investment firm Voyant Partners, where he spearheaded the acquisition of a geo-spatial patent portfolio and its subsequent sale to Samsung. Earlier in his career, Bill directed marketing for *The Washington Post* and worked as a journalist with *The Associated Press*.
