VISITING SCHOLAR POSITIONS

Indiana State University seeks one or more faculty members as visiting scholars in public policy and financial services. Scholars are expected to develop and conduct research and to present their findings in conjunction with the Department of Political Science and its Master's of Public Administration program, the financial services program of the Scott College of Business, and Networks Financial Institute. Participation in events and policy briefs at local, state and national levels is expected. Curriculum development and limited teaching opportunities are also available.

Visiting terms range from 3 - 12 months, beginning June 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2011. Successful candidates must have an earned Ph.D. in political science, public policy, or similar field. Evidence of successful scholarship in public policy pertaining to the financial services sector and evidence of successful teaching and/or policy presentations to policy makers and industry are required. Academic experience at the assistant, associate, or full professor rank or substantial research experience in the area of public policy pertaining to financial services is preferred.

Applications will be accepted until the position is filled, but those received after May 31, 2010 cannot be assured consideration. Salary is commensurate with experience and is based on the duration of the visiting term.
