The teaching functions include various courses in insurance and economics for all Bachelor and Master programs of the faculty. The professorship is in particular responsible for a continuation of the DAV certification of the insurance courses and the long-distance teaching courses in the context of professional education at the faculty. The applicant should have experience with respect to the acquisition of grants and funding in general.

Conditions for appointment are a completed course of studies at a university, pedagogical aptitude, doctorate and additional academic achievements (§ 47 LHG).

The University of Ulm is committed to increase the share of women in research and teaching positions and therefore explicitly encourages female candidates to apply.
